The University

- In the global top 100 universities
- Top Scottish University for Student Satisfaction
- Top of the Scottish Ancient Universities for widening participation
- A broad-based, research-intensive institution
- Over 100 listed buildings

• Economic impact

- Employs approx 1 in 70 of all workers in Glasgow
- Annual turnover in excess of £0.5bn
- Total output of £1.2bn
- Contributes 3.2% of annual GDP of Glasgow
- GVA multiplier of 2.09 (UK)
- 13% of Scotland's international students. It is estimated that the international body added around £70m to the Scottish economy in 2014

- Site Enabling works – Sept to Dec 2016
- Appointment of Delivery Partner (Contractor) – Jan/Feb 2016
- Modular Building and Decant – January - April 2017
- Demolitions – February 2017 onwards
- Construction of first buildings – Spring 2017 - Summer 2018
- Temporary occupation of Listed Buildings
- Parallel investment strategy
- Phased delivery and implementation over decade
